
What is Reflexology?


- Reflexology is a gentle and noninvasive technique using finger pressure to stimulate reflex areas.
- Benefits of reflexology include:
 - > Reduced tension, pain, and stress.
 - > Improved circulation.
 - > Detoxification of waste.
 - Promotes self-healing and wellness.





Types of Reflexology










Feet Hands Face Ears



Reflex Areas

- Reflexology follows the principle that stimulation of reflex areas correspond with every organ, gland, muscle, and joint of the body.
- Application of pressure on reflex areas can improve body function.





Why Reflexology?



Gentle and Non-invasive

Treats the entire body in 1 session

Cost-effective

Clothing is not removed



What Does a Session Look Like?

- For your 1st session, it will begin with a consultation (health history, how reflexology works, desired outcome).
- You will sit or lay in a comfortable position on a massage table or chair.
- Gentle pressure is used on reflex areas.



Session: approx. 1 hour





Continuing education is also provided by many RABC Reflexology Teachers to support Approved Practitioners to earn the Continuing Education Credits they require to maintain their Approved Reflexology Practitioner Status.
