What is an Approved Practitioner?



- RABC Approved Reflexology Practitioners have the option to work at:
 - Existing businesses
 - Their own place of business
 - Home-based/ mobile businesses
- RABC Approved Reflexology Practitioners have the required education and courses to keep their approved status.



RABC Membership

- Benefits include:
 - Your business contact info is posted on the RABC website.
 - Free advertising of any courses and workshops.
 - Clients can submit their receipt if they have Extended Health Insurance, to be reimbursed for a portion of their session cost.



Must be an **Approved Reflexology Practitioner** to have session costs covered by Health Insurance.



Obtaining “Approved” Status



- Must complete course requirements:
 - A minimum 40 hours classroom study and a minimum of 60 hours practicum.
- Must pass the RABC Proficiency Examinations:
 - Passing grade =
80% on Written & 80% on Practical



Keeping “Approved” Status

- To maintain Approved Reflexology Practitioner membership status in good standing:
 - Membership fee is due each year in January.
 - Required to submit your **Continuing Education Credits** every 3 years.





With Another Association?

- If you already hold a professional designation with another Reflexology Association:
 - The association must be an **RABC Recognized Association** (list online).
 - Fill out the **New Membership Application** and submit the required documents under Approved Reflexology Practitioner Membership.

Approved Practitioner checklist on Membership Application:

4. APPROVED REFLEXOLOGY PRACTITIONER MEMBERSHIP Category – submit the required documents:

<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	c	a copy of the REFLEXOLOGY Certificates(s) indicating successful completion of the course(s) that includes a minimum of 40 hours classroom instruction, and 60 hours of practicum;
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	d	a copy of the RABC Proficiency Examinations results or approved equivalent examinations, as per the RABC BOARD, with a minimum passing grade of 80% on the written exam and on the practical exam;
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	e	a completed RABC Website Directory Application (if you want to be listed on RABC website);
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	f	if you are already a reflexology practitioner who has met the standards of an RABC recognized Association, submit a copy of your Professional Reflexology Certificate – and if so item c) and item d) in this list is not required;
<input checked="" type="checkbox"/>	g	an indication of agreement to collect and submit CE Credits as required: 30 Continuing Education Credits are required every 3 years to maintain "Approved Reflexology Status". For more information on CE Credits see RABC website.
